- 1. (a) Your course mate when asked to define Public Administration by Miss Pauline, your lecturer, proffered this definition. 'Public administration is the single most important aspect of bureaucracies across the world; be it a democratic, socialist or a capitalist state, more so in a socialist state, as all aspects of the citizens' life are influenced and decided by the government.' Analyse the definition. 15 marks
 - (b) Law consists of rules that regulate the conduct of individuals, businesses and other organizations within the society. Laws of a given society are promulgated in order to protect and sustain that society's values. Law therefore protects citizens and their property against unwanted interference from others. It prescribes penalties for citizens or persons who engage in undesirable activities. What do you suppose would happen if societies are not governed by laws? Give five (5) points. **10 marks**
- 2. Enumerate ten (10) Executive Bodies whose composition and powers are contained in part 1 of the third schedule to the 1999 Constitution.

According to the provisions of section 148(1) of the 1999 Constitution, "the President may, in his discretion, assign to the ... or any Minister of the Government of the Federation responsibility for any business of the Government of the Federation, including the administration of any department of government." Analyse this statement.
