- (e) Explain the following reactions: (i) Reformatsky reaction (ii) Perkin reaction(8 marks)
- (f) Give the names of the two (2) intermediate species formed in the mechanism of Wittig reaction (2 marks)

2. (a) Define oxidation with reference to organic molecules and give two (2) examples to illustrate your definition. (8 marks)

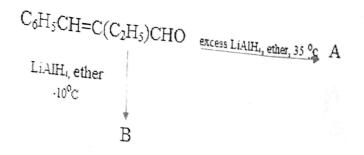
