QUESTION ONE

(a) The demand and supply functions of a commodity are given as follows:

Qd = 500 - 30P

Qs = 240 + 70P

Required:

- (i) Determine the equilibrium price and quantity bought and sold (12marks)
- (ii) If the price of the commodity is fixed at N10, what is the magnitude of excess supply (4 marks)
- (iii) If the price of the commodity is fixed at N5, what is the magnitude of excess demand (4 marks)

(b) Every economic system has goals such as financial security and freedom to carry out economic choices. What are the goals of every economic system? (10 marks)

Differentiate between the following:

- (a) Increasing returns to scale and decreasing returns to scale (5 marks)
- (b) Implicit and Explicit Costs (5 marks)
- (c) Accounting and Economic profit (5 marks)
- (d) Cost and Outlay (5 marks)

QUESTION THREE

a) Assume the short-run cost function of a particular firm is given as:

 $C = 0.1q^3 - 2q^2 + 15q + 10$

Required:

- i. Obtain the Marginal Cost (3 marks)
- ii. Get the Average cost of production (3 marks)
- iii. Derive the Average Variable Cost of production (3 marks)

iv. Show that the Marginal Cost is equal to the Average Variable Cost at the minimum point of the AVC (6 marks)

b) What is the effect of external economies of scale? (5 marks)

QUESTION FOUR

A Discriminating monopolist whose demand and cost functions are given below separated his consumers into two markets:

 $P_1 = 160 - q_1 \text{ and } P_2 = 360 - q_2, \ C = 50 + 20 \ (q_1 + q_2).$

You are required to determine:

(a) output level where profit is maximized. (7marks)

(b) price charged in each market (3marks)

(c) profit maximizing level (4marks)

(d) Distinguish between a perfect competitive firm and monopolistic competition (6marks)
