- 4. In what three (3) ways did Edward Franklin Albee's *The Zoo Story* reflect the characteristics of the 20th century Theater of the Absurd? (15 marks/40 minutes)
- Claude McKay brilliantly reverses the thematic focus and the tone of the sonnet genre from love, and substitutes them with hate and its accompanying tone.
 Examine this statement by carrying out a literal analysis of McKay's poem, 'Enslaved', paying particular attention on the theme, tone, and structure of the poem.
